11 TO REQUEST THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF
12 TRANSPORTATION NAME EXT 190 ALONG INTERSTATE
13 HIGHWAY 95 IN DILLON COUNTY THE "BEN BERNANKE
14 INTERCHANGE" AND ERECT APPROPRIATE MARKERS
15 OR SIGNS AT THE EXIT THAT CONTAIN THE WORDS
16 "BEN BERNANKE INTERCHANGE".

18 Whereas, Dr. Ben S. Bernanke grew up in Dillon county, acquiring
19 knowledge and developing integrity and personal skills in rural
20 South Carolina; and

21

22 Whereas, this solid foundation is the building block upon which
23 Dr. Bernanke has established an impressive career as an
24 economist, leading him to become highly respected in his
25 and

26

27 Whereas, on February 1, 2006, he was sworn in as Chairman of the
28 Board of Governors of the United States Federal Reserve System,
29 appointed by President George W. Bush to succeed Alan
30 Greenspan; and

32 Whereas, he also serves as Chairman of the Federal Open Market
33 Committee, the system's principal monetary policymaking body;
34 and

36 Whereas, he was previously Chairman of the United States
37 President's Council of Economic Advisers from 2005 to 2006, and
38 a member of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve since
39 2002; and

41 Whereas, Dr. Bernanke has also served the Federal Reserve
42 System as a visiting scholar at the Federal Reserve Banks of

1 Philadelphia (1987-1990), Boston (1989-1990), and New York
2 (1990-1991, 1994-1996); and a member of the Academic Advisory
3 Panel at the Federal Reserve Bank of New York (1991-2002); and
4
5 Whereas, from 1994 to 1996, he was the class of 1926 Professor of
6 Economics and Public Affairs at Princeton University. He was the
7 Howard Harrison and Gabrielle Snyder Beck Professor
8 Economics and Public Affairs and Chair of the Economics
9 Department at the university from 1996 to 2002. He has been a
10 Professor of Economics and Public Affairs at Princeton since
11 1985; and
12
13 Whereas, before arriving at Princeton, Dr. Bernanke taught a
14 Stanford University, New York University, and the Massachusetts
15 Institute of Technology; and
16
17 Whereas, he received his Bachelor of Arts degree in economics
18 from Harvard University (summa cum laude) and a Ph.D. in
19 economics from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, and is
20 married and has two children; and
21
22 Whereas, Dillon County and South Carolina are proud to have Dr.
23 Bernanke as a native son, and would like all who travel Interstate
24 Highway 95 to know that he is from our State. Now, therefore,
25
26 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives, the Senate
27 concurring:
28
29 That the members of the General Assembly request that the
30 Department of Transportation name Exit 190 along Interstate
31 Highway 95 in Dillon County the "Ben Bernanke Interchange" and
32 erect appropriate markers or signs at this exit that contain the
33 words "Ben Bernanke Interchange".

35 Be it further resolved that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to
36 the Department of Transportation.
