



A Teenage Girl Dies in CERES Pedestrian V. Car Accident

Five teenage girls from Ceres were on the way to school when they were hit by a pick-up truck on Wednesday morning. One of the girls was pronounced dead. The other was transported to the US Davis Medical Center in critical condition. The girls were struck while crossing a street close to Mae Hensley Junior High School. The **Ceres car accident** remains under investigation. It is not reported that drugs or alcohol were involved.

All circumstances of **Ceres injury accident** remain under investigation, although it appears the driver of the vehicle may be partially responsible. In all pedestrian versus car collisions, witness accounts are essential. However there may be other information that can influence who will be deemed responsible, in whole or in part, for a pedestrian versus vehicle incident. California Vehicle Code Section 21950 states that “the driver of a vehicle shall yield the right-of-way to a pedestrian” within a crosswalk, and that a driver approaching a pedestrian in a crosswalk “shall exercise all due care and shall reduce the speed of a vehicle or take any other action relating to the operating of the vehicle as necessary to safeguard the safety of the pedestrian.”
