



## Woman Killed in Single Car Accident in Elk Grove

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An unidentified female passenger died in an Elk Grove auto accident on Monday morning. The woman was a passenger in a 1995 Toyota Camry that was proceeding south bound near the 8400 block of Power Inn Road when it went off the road, jolt several trees then overturned, coming to rest on its roof. The female passer was pronounced dead at the scene. The driver and another passenger were transported to area hospitals with non-life threatening injuries. This Elk Grove injury accident remains under investigation and it has not been determined whether alcohol or drugs were involved.

Although the cause of the crash remains under investigation, the driver of the Camry is more than likely responsible from a legal standpoint to compensate the heirs of the injured passenger. Nothing is more devastating than losing a loved one, especially if it is unexpected and as the result of someone's negligence. The law provides that certain family members, usually a spouse, child or parent, have the right to recover compensation for certain losses if someone is liable for causing another person's death. These losses include both economic and non-economic damages. The most significant economic loss recoverable in a wrongful death claim is typically the loss of financial support and other benefits that the deceased would have provided in his or her lifetime to the person making the claim. Non-economic damages include the loss of love, support and companionship of the deceased person. Anyone who has lost a loved one as the result of another's negligence or carelessness is advised to contact an experienced California Personal Injury Attorney who will hire investigators and accident reconstruction experts to conduct a thorough investigation of the incident, advise the victim of all legal rights, and file a lawsuit if necessary to obtain fair compensation.

The driver of the Camry is also likely liable to the injured passenger for his injuries, including the ambulance bill, the hospital bill, any lost income, and pain and suffering. In most cases, the driver's insurance would pay for these losses. If he has no insurance, the passengers may be able to recover under the uninsured motorist provision of an auto insurance policy held by someone in their household. Anyone seriously injured in a motor vehicle collision has a number of serious issues to deal with after a collision like this.
