

KNOWING WHEN TO HIRE OR CONSULT A LAWYER IN ALABAMA

Also hiring a lawyer after suffering a serious injury that was caused by the negligence of someone else or a caused by the negligence of a corporation normally does not result in out-of-pocket legal fees. Most attorneys charge only if you successfully recover damages from the third party, such as an insurance company, and they charge a percentage of the recovery instead of an hourly fee. This is called a contingency fee because it is contingent on the lawyer successfully recovering damages as a result of your injury.

Contact an attorney immediately if you have been sued or arrested. These types of situations are normally very cut and dried in terms of whether you need legal representation. However, there are many reasons why you may need to hire an attorney. For example, you may want to consult with an attorney before you fire a problem employee. You may also want to consult an attorney if you have been seriously injured. Additionally, if you are unsure of your insurance coverage or you have questions about your insurance policy and the benefits owed to you and your family, you may want to consult an attorney. If you have suffered an on-the-job injury in Alabama that is covered by the Alabama Workers' Compensation Act, and you are having difficulty either getting reasonable medical care or difficulty in collecting weekly compensation payments, then consulting an attorney is a wise decision.

If you are not prepared to hire a lawyer for your situation, it is still a wise decision to consult an attorney on your rights. A good question to ask yourself if you are unsure about needing legal advice or assistance is what do you have to lose? If your answer is freedom, money, or other rights, then consulting with a lawyer is a wise decision.

You should understand the scope of your situation before contacting an attorney. There are different types of lawyers in Alabama, each dealing with certain types of legal problems and situations. It is a good idea to know whose expertise is needed even though most lawyers will let you know if you need to contact someone else.
