Before the court is defendant's motion for judgment on the pleadings on plaintiffs' third claim pursuant to Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 12(c).<sup>1</sup> For purposes of defendant's motion, the allegations of the non-moving party must be accepted as true and all inferences reasonably drawn from those facts must be construed in the non-moving party's favor. Hal Roach Studios, Inc. v. Richard Feiner and Co., Inc., 896 F.2d 1542, 1550 (9<sup>th</sup> Cir. 1990); General Conference Corp. of Seventh-Day Adventists v. Seventh-Day Adventist Congregational Church, 887 F.2d 228, 230 (9<sup>th</sup> Cir. 1989). Judgment on the pleadings is not appropriate if plaintiff's complaint raises

1 issues of fact, which, if proved, would support recovery.

2 Seventh-Day Adventist, 887 F.2d at 230.

3 Contrary to defendant's argument, the issue posed by the  
4 third claim in plaintiffs' complaint is not whether the  
5 referendum procedure itself as contained in California Food  
6 and Agriculture Code section 62717 is unconstitutional. As  
7 stated by plaintiffs, their claim is that the referendum  
8 procedure "as applied to plaintiffs by defendant in denying  
9 plaintiff's petition for relief," (Pl.'s Compl. ¶ 38),  
10 violates their right to procedural due process, given the  
11 adverse interests of plaintiffs and the rest of the milk  
12 producers eligible to vote of which the defendant is alleged  
13 to be aware.

14 Given plaintiffs' allegation, I cannot say as a matter of  
15 law that plaintiffs will be unable to prove a set of facts in  
16 which the perceived need for a majority of conventional milk  
17 producers to approve the changes in the milk regulatory scheme  
18 plaintiffs seek would not establish a fundamental unfairness  
19 that may violate plaintiffs' due process rights. Because the  
20 complaint raises issues of fact that could support plaintiffs'  
21 recovery, judgment on the pleadings on plaintiff's third claim  
22 is **DENIED**.
