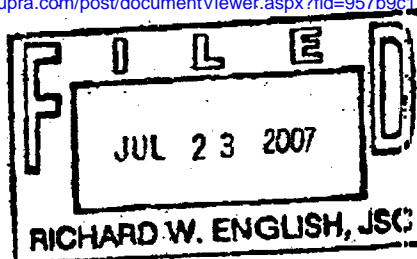

ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE
 WITH TEMPORARY RESTRAINTS
 PURSUANT TO RULE 4:52

THIS MATTER being brought to the Court by Stuart J. Moskowitz, Esq., Pro Se Defendant, (Stuart J. Moskowitz, Esq.), seeking relief by way of temporary restraints pursuant to R. 4:52, based upon the facts set forth in the Verified Complaint filed herewith; and it appearing that Plaintiff, Township of Manalapan, by its attorneys Ruprecht, Hart & Weeks, PC (David P Weeks, Esq.) and Rogut, McCarthy & Troy, LLC (Daniel J. McCarthy, Esq.), had notice of the application and the Court having entered a preliminary Order on July 17, 2007, granting temporary relief and setting the matter down for a return date on July 23, 2007; and a telephone conference having been held by the Court and the attorneys for the respective parties appearing on July 19, 2007:

IT IS on this 23rd day of July, 2007, ORDERED that all parties shall appear and show cause before the Superior Court at the Monmouth County Courthouse in Freehold, New Jersey at 1:30 p.m. on the 20th day of August, 2007 why an Order should not be issued:

A. Dismissing the Complaint;

B. Mandating the indemnification of Defendant, Stuart J. Moskovitz, Esq., by Plaintiff, Township of Manalapan; Granting such other relief as the court deems equitable and just;

AND it is further ORDERED that pending the return date herein, the Plaintiff, Township of Manalapan, including the Township elected officials, employees, and Township attorneys and staff, and Defendant, Stuart J. Moskovitz, Esq., are enjoined and restrained from: Communicating with the press and the public concerning the subject matter of this litigation;

AND it is further ORDERED that the portion of the July 17, 2007 Order directing counsel for the Plaintiff to assure Defendant that the Manalapan Township Elected Officials are in receipt of all communications, etc., relative to this litigation is vacated;

AND it is further ORDERED that:

1. A copy of this Order to Show Cause, Verified Complaint, Legal Memorandum and any supporting affidavits or certifications submitted in support of this application be served upon the Plaintiff by fax and regular mail within 3 days of the date hereof, in accordance with R. 4:4-3 and R. 4:4-4, this being original process.
2. The Defendant must file with the Court its proof of service of the pleadings on the Plaintiff no later than 3 days before the return date.
3. Plaintiff shall file and serve a written response to this Order to Show Cause and the request for entry of injunctive relief and proof of service by August 6, 2007. The original documents must be filed with the Clerk of the Superior Court in the county listed above. A list of these offices is provided. You must send a copy of your opposition papers directly to Judge Richard W. English, J.S.C., whose address is Monmouth County Courthouse, 71 Monument Park, P.O. Box 1266, Freehold, New Jersey 07728-1266. You must also send a copy of your opposition papers to the Defendant's attorney whose name and address appears above, or to the Defendant, if no attorney is named above. A telephone call will not protect

your rights; you must file your opposition and pay the required fee of

\$ _____ and serve your opposition on your adversary, if you want the court to hear your opposition to the injunctive relief the Plaintiff is seeking;

4. The Defendant must file and serve any written reply to the Plaintiff's Order to Show Cause opposition by August 13, 2007. The reply papers must be filed with the Clerk of the Superior Court in the County listed above and a copy of the reply papers must be sent directly to the chambers of Judge Richard W. English, J.S.C.
5. If the Plaintiff does not file and serve opposition to this Order to Show Cause, the application will be decided on the papers on the return date and relief may be granted by default, provided that the Defendant files a proof of service and a proposed form of Order at least 3 days prior to the return date.
