- 5. Getting too emotional.

If you avoid litigation mistakes and move forward with the best interests of the business in mind, rather than letting personal or emotional issues guide your actions, you might find that litigation can be handled like any other business obstacle, and that you and your company can emerge from the experience wiser and with renewed focus.

Litigation may be unwelcome but that's no excuse for dealing with it unprofessionally and without proper guidance.
