JUDGMENTS

New South Wales (NSW)

30 July 2014 - ARC v Northern NSW Local Health District [2014] NSWCATAD 109

The applicant applied to the NSW Civil and Administrative Tribunal seeking removal of a Mental Health Access Line Handover Report from the applicant's mental health file. The Report was made when the applicant contacted the Mental Health Access Line. The applicant argued that the Report contained information about her that was false, misleading, exaggerated and/or out of date and therefore claimed that the Report breached the accuracy health privacy principles under the *Health Records Information Privacy Act*.

The respondent refused to destroy or remove the Report from the applicant's mental health record. It contended that it did not breach the health privacy principles as the information was in fact an accurate record at the time it was made.

On the facts, the Tribunal found that the Report accurately reflected the record at the time the applicant contacted the Access Line. The Tribunal nevertheless confirmed that even if this was not the case, health records could not be amended so as to 'rewrite history.' As such, the Tribunal held that the respondent had not breached the accuracy health privacy principles by refusing to destroy or remove the Report from the applicant's mental health file.

30 July 2014 - Health Services Union NSW v Peter Mylan [2014] NSWSC 1026

Evidence- self-incrimination - *Evidence Act 1995* (NSW) s 128 - where plaintiff seeks the grant of a certificate in respect of evidence to be given by a witness who has agreed to provide an affidavit but only on condition that such a certificate is granted - held requirements of s 128 not met and certificate cannot be granted because the witness has not objected to giving particular evidence under compulsion - Certificate refused - procedure - advance rulings and findings - s192A of the *Evidence Act 1995* (NSW).

30 July 2014 - Holbrook v Health Care Complaints Commission (HCCC) [2014] NSWCATOD 86

Registration previously cancelled; boundary violations; not of good character; impairment; criminal conviction; application to be re-registered; onus of proof; failure to discharge onus.

30 July 2014 - Deano v Health Care Complaints Commission [2014] NSWCATOD 85

Health practitioner regulation - nurse - cancellation of registration following finding of professional misconduct - Application under s 163 A of the *Health Practitioner Regulation National Law* (NSW) 2009 (National Law) for review of order cancelling registration - where HCCC opposes application - whether deficits identified had been remedied - whether risk to the public if former Registered Nurse is re-instated to register - whether former nurse has insight into her past inappropriate conduct - whether former nurse has demonstrated by her actions that it is appropriate she be restored to the register - where former nurse has undertaken and completed further education - where nurse's written material in support of application and her oral evidence demonstrates conflicting attitude about her insight - failure to pay costs as ordered by previous tribunal and court.

30 July 2014 - Health Care Complaints Commission v Fraser (No 2) [2014] NSWCATOD 84

Administrative law - Civil and Administrative Tribunal (NSW) - occupational division - health practitioners list - unsatisfactory professional conduct and professional misconduct - where HCCC assert conduct of sufficiently serious nature to warrant cancellation of the practitioner's registration - where practitioner conceded some particulars of the complaint. Where practitioner asserts no risk to health or safety of public - whether de-registration required or reprimand and/or conditions are adequate protective orders - practitioner's registration should be cancelled.

22 July 2014 - Health Care Complaints Commission v Khan [2014] NSWCATOD 83

Complaint - where complaint asserts unsatisfactory professional conduct and professional misconduct - where Health Care Complaints Commission seek to withdraw the complaint. Whether it is not in the public interest for inquiry to be heard. Whether single member of Tribunal has jurisdiction to dismiss the complaint

Queensland

27 June 2014 (published 30 July 2014) - Vega Vega v Medical Board of Australia [2014] QCAT 328

This was an appeal by a doctor to the Queensland Civil and Administrative Tribunal of decisions made by the Medical Board of Australia to take immediate action against him and suspend, or alternatively impose conditions on, his registration.

The doctor had removed the wrong kidney during a nephrectomy procedure because the kidney had become so displaced it had moved across the midline. The patient had a complicated medical history including spina bifida, paraplegia and numerous other chronic conditions. The doctor had commenced the nephrectomy as laparoscopic surgery but because of significant bleeding from the renal vein, had converted to an open procedure. The nephrectomy took seven hours when it usually only takes between two and four hours.

The Board considered it was inappropriate for the procedure to have been undertaken at the hospital (which was not a major tertiary teaching hospital) in the absence of another specialist urologist and had taken immediate action on this basis. The doctor appealed arguing he acted reasonably.

The Tribunal overturned the decision of the Board as it did not think the doctor posed a serious risk to persons. It said that while surgery inherently entails serious risks, these are a matter for the judgment of a practitioner. The Tribunal determined that the doctor was capable of exercising that judgment. Moreover, it determined that the decision not to refer the patient for the surgery at a major hospital was reasonable as it would not have led to the procedure being performed any differently.
