

COVID-19 State Responses

November 18, 2020

**Wiley continues to closely monitor the COVID-19 crisis and will update this list as new information is available. This alert was originally published on March 25, 2020, and last updated on November 18, 2020.*

1. Alabama

- Governor's latest direction (November 5, 2020 – Stay at Home Order.)
- Supreme Court of Alabama (August 14, 2020 – COVID-19 Pandemic Emergency Response Order extending orders pertaining to worker's compensation cases and remote testimony.)
- District Court for the Northern District of Alabama (September 8, 2020 – Executive Order re extending the authorization of the use of video and audio to conduct criminal proceedings.)
- District Court for the Middle District of Alabama (September 18, 2020 – Order re criminal proceedings by video or audio conference.)
- District Court for the Southern District of Alabama (July 9, 2020 – all persons entering the courthouse must wear masks and will be subjected to coronavirus (COVID-19) screening. Remote criminal proceedings under the CARES Act, use of video for public access to proceedings, entrance restrictions based on recent travel.)

2. Alaska

- Governor's "Reopen Alaska Responsibly Plan" (May 19, 2020 – Phase Three began May 22, 2020, and allows all businesses, libraries, religious spaces, etc. to open at 100% capacity. Hygiene and social distancing methods are encouraged. Masks are encouraged but not required.)
 - June 3, 2020 – new travel guidelines and testing/quarantine requirements for those entering the state.
- Alaska Supreme Court (November 2, 2020 – Order re reporters requesting permission about overseeing hearings and streaming death trials.)
- District Court for the District of Alaska (Civil hearings and jury trials are postponed until after December 7, 2020.)

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- July 9, 2020 – face coverings required in court facilities for all persons without a preventive medical condition, and over two years of age. Due to difficulty scheduling virtual appearances for in-custody defendants, courts may schedule hearings during evenings and weekends. Persons with a likelihood of spreading COVID-19 may not enter courthouses. Civil hearings and all jury trials are postponed until after September 4, 2020. Electronic filing; no courtesy copies except in social security cases.)

3. Arizona

- Governor’s latest direction (November 11, 2020 – Executive Order re: Enhanced Surveillance Advisory Monitoring the Spread of COVID-19.)
 - July 23, 2020 – as Arizona’s number of cases increases, the governor has recently halted the state’s reopening and added the following orders:
 - Order 52 (July 23, 2020 – extends Order 43: prohibition on gatherings of 50+ people, festival/fair liquor licenses, and in-person bars. This order will be reviewed every 2 weeks until further notice.)
 - Order 51 (July 23, 2020 – return-to-school guidelines must be posted by August 7, 2020, and all schools must start remote. Schools should begin offering on-site opportunities to students with the most need starting August 17, 2020. Schools must require face coverings for students over the age of 5. Previously, Order 44 delayed the school year start to August 17, 2020 (Arizona schools typically start in July) and waived the requirement for a certain number of school days in the academic year.)
 - Order 50 (July 22, 2020 – efforts to establish safe in-person voting protocols.)
 - Order 49 (July 16, 2020 – continued postponement of eviction enforcement actions.)
 - From previous orders (Remote online notarization. Implementation of statewide contact tracing. Limitations on indoor dining. Businesses must adopt and enforce written policies in line with Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) recommendations for mitigating the spread of infection. Local governments can adopt policies regarding face coverings. Mandatory reporting of data related to PPE, testing, and supplies for all hospitals, nursing homes, and labs. Nursing homes and healthcare institutions must report new COVID-19 cases and deaths within 24 hours to any incoming or current residents and their guardians or next of kin.)
- Arizona Supreme Court (October 22, 2020 – Administrative Order re: Extending Superior Court Hours of Operation.)
- District Court for the District of Arizona (September 18, 2020 – General Order re the Extension of the CARES ACT Authorization and Miscellaneous Court Operations Under the Exigent Circumstances Created by COVID-19. Moratorium on jury trials is extended until further notice. Customer service counters in most of the Clerk’s Offices are closed. Each courthouse has different guidelines, but all persons attending hearings or trials must wear masks and comply with social distancing guidelines.)

4. Arkansas

- Governor’s latest orders (November 5, 2020 – Order re Exception to Jurors’ Terms of Service During The COVID-19 Public Health Emergency.)
- Arkansas Supreme Court (July 10, 2020 – temporary rule to allow persons properly registered for the July 2020 Arkansas Bar Exam, who are unwilling or unable to sit for the exam due to the COVID-19 pandemic, to engage in the temporary practice of law if supervised by an attorney. Up to 50 people can be in courtrooms if wearing face coverings, social distancing, and passing health screenings. To maintain social distancing, courts are encouraged to consider using facilities such as gymnasiums and conducting civil jury trials with only six jurors if all parties consent. Some jury trials and jury summonses resumed July 1, 2020. Civil jury trials may pursue videoconference options, while criminal jury trials will be in person by default.)

 - July 28, 2020 – mask requirement in all public spaces for all courthouses. All civil and criminal jury trials are postponed until further notice; courthouses are closed to the public. Civil matters will be “decided on the papers” or via teleconference. Authorization of electronic signatures and remote criminal proceedings in accordance with the CARES Act through September 24, 2020. Deadlines will remain in place unless ordered otherwise.
- District Court for the Southern District of California (October 14, 2020 – Order re proceedings during the COVID-19 public emergency.)
 - Motion to Appear Telephonically or by Videoconference (downloadable template).

6. Colorado

- Governor’s latest direction (October 8, 2020 – Second Amended Public Health Order 20-35 Safer at Home Dial.)
- Colorado Supreme Court (October 31, 2020 – Third Amended Administrative Order re Court Operations Under COVID-19 and Suspension of Jury Trials.)
 - Message to all Colorado attorneys (April 27, 2020 – details on various criminal and civil rule changes, emergency rule allowing law school graduates to practice if bar exam is postponed, technical developments to facilitate remote trials, and more.)
- District Court for the District of Colorado (November 5, 2020 – Order re Court Operations During The COVID-19 Pandemic.)
 - Clerk’s office is deemed “open” but is operating remotely. Pro se litigants must file via mail, drop box, or email. Other litigants may use e-filing. Cash payments will not be accepted.)

7. Connecticut

- Governor’s latest direction (November 9, 2020 – Executive Order re Protection of Public Health and Safety During COVID-19 Pandemic.)
- Connecticut Supreme Court (October 13, 2020 – Notice of Resumption of Civil Short Calendar 01 Civil Arguable Matters.)
- District Court for the District of Connecticut (September 25, 2020 – Order re court operations; CARES Act Reauthorization.)
 - July 14, 2020 – Extension of remote criminal proceedings under the CARES Act. Individual judges will now determine whether to have each non-jury proceeding in person. Mask requirement for all persons in courthouse. Continuance of all jury trials scheduled to start through November 2, 2020, but some civil jury selections and trials may begin starting September 1, 2020

if a judge decides it can be done with sufficient safety measures. Counsel who wish to propose a case for trial during this period should file a joint motion for trial with the presiding judge. No courtesy copies when e-filing.

8. Delaware

- Governor's latest direction (November 5, 2020 – Twenty-Seventh Extension of the Declaration of a State of Emergency for the State of Delaware due to a Public Health Threat.)
- Delaware Supreme Court (November 2, 2020 – Administrative Order re Extension of Judicial Emergency.)
 - October 2, 2020 – Delaware Courts move to modified Phase 3 of reopening plan; Chief Justice extends judicial emergency to Nov. 4, 2020.
 - September 11, 2020 – Order re procedures for landlord/tenant matters.
 - Courtroom Protocols (Posted June 8, 2020 – new precautions in place for all in-person proceedings.)
 - Opening phases (Posted June 5, 2020.)
- District Court for the District of Delaware (October 9, 2020 – Notice re civil cases handled by Judges Noreika and Connolly and matters referred to Magistrate Judges Thyng, Fallon, and Hall.)
 - October 7, 2020 – Notice of Issuance of Jury Trial Restart Guidelines. (Jury Trial Restart Guidelines)

9. Florida

- Governor's latest direction (April 29, 2020 – Governor issues task force and information on re-opening; May 18, 2020 – Governor allows restaurants, retail and select businesses, such as gyms, barbershops and nail salons to reopen at 50% capacity; face masks are recommended; June 3, 2020 – Governor issues Phase 2 Plan for Florida's Recovery. August 5, 2020 – Governor issues Executive Order amending Executive Orders 20-68, 20-139, 20-166, and 20-179; August 7, 2020 – #2020-193 Executive Order extends Executive Order re: Emergency Management – COVID-19 – Local Government Public Meetings until October 1, 2020; August 27, 2020 – #2020-209 Executive Order re: Emergency Management – Termination of Executive Order 20-208; August 31, 2020 – #2020-211 Executive Order re: Limited Extension of Mortgage Foreclosure and Eviction Relief; September 4, 2020 – Executive Order extends Executive Order 20-52 COVID-19 Emergency Management. September 25, 2020 – Executive Order 20-244 re: Phase 3; Right to Work; Business Certainty; Suspension of Fines; September 30, 2020 – Executive Order 20-246 re: Emergency Management – COVID-19 – Local Government Public Meetings; October 23, 2020 – Executive Order 20-275 re: Emergency Management- Florida Department of Transportation – Fund Allocation Relief; November 3, 2020 – Executive Order 20-276 re: Emergency Management – Extension of Executive Order 20-52 – COVID-19.)
- Governor's direction on long-term care (May 13, 2020 presentation – Executive order prohibits outside visitors to long-term care facilities, and prohibits hospitals from sending COVID-19-positive patients back to long-term care facilities; Governor order regarding election processes; August 19, 2020 – Governor launches new survey tool for self-assessment and safe behavior scores on COVID-19.)
- Florida Supreme Court (April 1, 2020 – Chief Justice issued administrative order extending judicial filing reporting deadline; April 7, 2020 – Chief Justice issued administrative order extending deadlines for mediator certification and training and renewals of mediator certification through December 31, 2020; April 21, 2020 – Chief Justice issued administrative order creating a 17-member workgroup to recommend ways for a staged return to full court operations; May 4, 2020 – Chief Justice issued administrative order suspending all grand jury proceedings through July 2, 2020; May 11, 2020 – Chief Justice issued "Best Practices" guidelines for remote court proceedings; May 13, 2020 – Florida Supreme Court schedules more remote oral arguments in June. May 14, 2020 – issued administrative order re personal travel; May 22, 2020 - Chief Justice orders new pilot program for jury trials using remote technology; June 1, 2020 - Chief Justice adds law enforcement representative to COVID-19 Workgroup; June 8, 2020 - Chief Justices issues emergency order extending suspension of jury trials through July 17 & amending

- United States District Court for the Northern District of Florida (April 27, 2020 – courthouses closed to the public; use of teleconferencing where possible; May 7, 2020 – Administrative order keeps all courthouses closed with few exceptions; teleconferencing where possible; June 17, 2020 – COVID-19 Updates; June 26, 2020 – administrative order on facemasks in public areas at court; July 27, 2020 – the United States Courthouse and the Winston E. Arnow Federal Building, located in the Pensacola Division of the Court, will be reopened to the public; August 12, 2020 – Administrative Order for Preventative Measures.)
- United States District Court for the Middle District of Florida (March 13, 2020 – standard exposure and foreign travel restrictions for visitors to the court. Closure of public intake areas; March 20, 2020 – large gatherings at the courthouse and jury trials are continued through at least May 31, 2020; March 29, 2020 – Chief Judge issues administrative order announcing video or audio conferences for some court proceedings; April 8, 2020 – Litigants without access to e-filing must use this form to file; April 10, 2020 – The public/media can access court proceedings remotely; June 29, 2020 - administrative order to extend the court's authority under the CARES Act to conduct some criminal proceedings by video or audio conference for an additional 90 days through September 25, 2020; September 22, 2020 – Order extending Court's authority to conduct some criminal proceedings by video or audio conference through November 24, 2020.)
- United States District Court for the Southern District of Florida (April 3, 2020 – Judges are strongly encouraged to conduct court proceedings by telephone or video conferencing; all grand juries scheduled to begin on or after March 30, 2020, are continued until July 6, 2020 and all trial-specific deadlines in criminal cases scheduled to begin before July 6, 2020, are continued pending further Order of the Court; essential operations only; April 20, 2020 – updated information on public access to video and teleconference hearings; May 15, 2020 – COVID-19 Update on Federal Bureau of Prisons (BOP); June 29, 2020 – order extending Cafra deadlines for certain administrative-forfeiture seizures; July 29, 2020 – Fifth order concerning jury trials and other proceedings; August 11, 2020 – sixth order concerning jury trials and other proceedings; October 20, 2020 – Seventh Order concerning Jury Trials and Other Proceedings (COVID-19.)

10. Georgia

- Governor's latest direction (April 3, 2020 – Governor issued Executive Order to deputize sheriffs for enforcement of stay-at-home order involving businesses, establishments, for-profit and non-profit corporations, and organizations; April 20, 2020 – Governor issued Executive Order providing flexibility for healthcare practices, moving certain businesses to minimum operations, and providing for emergency response; May 6, 2020 – state of emergency has been extended through June 12; May 12, 2020 – new executive order offers provisions, including the closure of live performance venues, bars, and nightclubs until May 31, 2020. The shelter in place provision remains active for the “medically fragile” and citizens ages 65+ until June 12, 2020; May 28, 2020 – Governor issued Order “Reviving A Healthy Georgia.”; June 11, 2020 – additional guidance regarding a healthy Georgia in response to COVID-19; July 24, 2020 – State of Emergency renewed; August 10, 2020 – State of Emergency renewed; August 15, 2020 – Executive Order re Empowering a Healthy Georgia; August 31, 2020 – Executive Order re: Providing additional guidance for Empowering a Healthy Georgia in response to COVID-19; August 31, 2020 – Executive Order re: Renewing the Public Health State of Emergency last renewed on July 31, 2020 in response to COVID-19; September 15, 2020 – Executive Order re: Providing additional guidance for Empowering Healthy Georgia in response to COVID-19; September 30, 2020 – Executive Order extending

Clerk's Office will remain closed for in-person business; August 13, 2020 – Amended Standing Order 2020-09 in re: COVID-19 Reopening Entrance Requirements; August 21, 2020 – Order Extending Jury Trial Moratorium through October 19, 2020; October 8, 2020 – Order Extending Jury Trial Moratorium through January 3, 2021.)
- United States District Court for the Southern District of Georgia (March 17, 2020 – visitor restrictions, jury trials – excepting grand juries, are paused March 17-April 17; March 30, 2020 – order authorizing videoconferencing; April 9, 2020 – standing order authorizing criminal defendant's counsel or presiding judge to sign for defendant; April 16, 2020 – order regarding criminal case docket; May 21, 2020 – standing order regarding court operations; July 28, 2020 – time period, August 1, 2020 to September 30, 2020, is excluded under the Speedy Trial Act.)

11. Hawaii

- Governor's latest direction (March 21, 2020 – Implemented a mandatory self-quarantine for all persons entering the State, effective Thursday, March 26, 2020; law enforcement action for violating traveling self-quarantine rule; May 5, 2020 – supplemental proclamation re COVID-19; June 3, 2020 – Governor releases Reopening Strategy; Governor extends the COVID-19 emergency period through July 31, 2020; June 10, 2020 – Governor extends COVID-19 emergency period through July, lifting inter-island quarantine at the end of June; July 27, 2020 – considered by Japan in list of global destinations to resume safe international travel; August 6, 2020 – 11th Proclamation related to the COVID-19 emergency interisland travel quarantine; August 20, 2020 – 12th Proclamation extending the COVID-19 emergency period through September, 30, 2020. September 8, 2020 – Governor announces COVID-19 rent relief and housing assistance program; September 23, 2020 – Thirteenth Proclamation re: COVID-19 Emergency; October 13, 2020 – Fourteenth Proclamation re: COVID-19 Emergency.)

- Hawaii Supreme Court (March 20, 2020 – courthouse closed to public except for official business. Most cases postponed until after April 3, 2020; April 17, 2020 - Chief Justice ordered that trials in civil, criminal, and family courts be postponed to a date after May 29, 2020 or the termination of state of emergency; April 24, 2020 – utilize video conferencing to conduct May 5 oral argument; May 28, 2020 – order regarding judiciary operations; June 23, 2020 – order regarding judiciary operations and order regarding jury trials; July 24, 2020 – passing score for bar exam temporarily modified to 133 for applicants sitting for the exam on September 9, 2020; August 6, 2020 – South Kohala District Court to reopen August 18, 2020. August 11, 2020 – Judiciary Facility Entry Restrictions Modified for Maui, Hawaii, and Kauai Counties; August 28, 2020 – Order Extending the deadline for bar applicants to choose to defer taking the exam to a future date; September 28, 2020 – Order re: Jury Trials Resumption; September 28, 2020 – Order re: Judiciary Operations.)
- United States District Court for the District of Hawaii (March 23, 2020 – All trials are continued through May 3, all settlement conferences to be electronic or rescheduled, time sensitive matters for magistrate judges will continue; March 30, 2020 – order authorizing use of telephonic hearings per the CARES Act; April 16, 2020 – issued temporary general order continuing all civil and criminal trials scheduled to commence before June 15, 2020; April 21, 2020 – temporary order regarding motions for compassion release; April 27, 2020 – order extending deadlines for administrative and civil judicial asset forfeiture proceedings; May 18, 2020 – guidance regarding civil case management; June 1, 2020 – Temporary general order in response to Hawaii response to COVID-19; order authorizing use of telephonic and video hearings pursuant to the CARES Act; June 29, 2020 – order authorizing the use of telephone and video hearings; July 28, 2020 – order authorizing the use of telephonic and video hearings pursuant to the CARES Act for the time period July 29, 2020 through August 27, 2020; August 11, 2020 – temporary order suspending grand jury sessions, order authorizing the use of telephonic and video hearings pursuant to the CARES Act; August 13, 2020 – Temporary Order re: response to COVID-19; August 24, 2020 – Temporary General Order re: Response to COVID-19, superseding the Court's August 13, 2020 order; September 10, 2020 – Order Authorizing the Use of Telephonic and Video Hearings through October 12, 2020; October 13, 2020 – Order superseding the Court's August 24, 2020 "Temporary General Order RE: Response to COVID-19;" November 12, 2020 – Temporary General Order re: Response to COVID-19.)

12. Idaho

- Governor's latest direction (April 25, 2020 – Governor extends statewide stay-home order and waives additional regulations; May 5, 2020 – general and business-specific protocols for opening announced; May 6, 2020 – indoor gyms/recreational facilities protocols for opening announced; May 19, 2020 – Governor established program to procure and distribute PPE to Idaho businesses and nonprofits; May 27, 2020 – Guidance for Safe Gatherings and Public Events; May 30, 2020 – Governor releases Stage 3 "Stay Healthy" order; June 3, 2020 – Governor releases information on reopening; June 13, 2020 – Idaho Stage 4 "Stay Healthy" Guidelines; June 25, 2020 – Governor extends Stage 4 for another two weeks. July 10, 2020 – Emergency Declaration Extension; August 19, 2020 – Proclamation declaring special legislative session to address election, civil liability during the pandemic; August 21, 2020 – Governor announces Idaho will remain in Stage 4 of the "Idaho Rebounds Plan" for another two weeks; October 5, 2020 – Emergency Declaration Extension.)
- Idaho Supreme Court (April 14, 2020 – all May 2020 hearings will be conducted via Zoom. Continuance of jury trials, deadline exceptions only in postponed cases.
