PharMerica and Amerita Sued in Class Actions for Breach of Patient Data

PharMerica and its subsidiary Amerita's Specialty Infusion Services (Amerita) are already facing class action lawsuits after patients received a September 5, 2023, data breach notification letter. When the businesses detected suspicious activity on both the PharMerica and Amerita networks, a forensic investigation determined that a threat actor had gained access to the systems sometime in early March 2023, allowing unauthorized access to approximately 5.8 million individuals. The type of information accessible included names, addresses, diagnoses, medications, and health insurance. The threat actor was identified as the Money Message ransomware group and the group posted data on its leak site from the 4.7 terabytes of stolen data. Read more

<u>Using Al to Replicate or Replace Human Creativity May Violate Intellectual Property Law</u>

As artificial intelligence (AI) becomes better and more prevalent, people will increasingly use its computing power to supplement or replace human creativity. Film director Gareth Edwards <u>attempted to do just that</u> in his new movie, *The Creator*, about artificial intelligence. Edwards used an AI algorithm to attempt to replicate the musical style of composer Hans Zimmer. Ultimately, Edwards abandoned this effort and hired Zimmer to compose the score because although the AI-generated track was convincing, Edwards believed it still felt short of human Zimmer's work. <u>Read more</u>

Linn Freedman Discusses the Legal Industry's Use of Al inHartford Business Journal Cover Story

Data Privacy + Cybersecurity Team chair Linn F. Freedman discussed the growing use of artificial intelligence by law firms in the article "Attorneys Slowly Embrace AI, But Urge Caution As Technology Rapidly Evolves," published in the *Hartford Business Journal* on October 2, 2023. In the cover story, Linn confirmed that "AI is here to stay" and that "AI tools are brilliant when it comes to increasing efficiency," but also acknowledged that "the output is only as good as the input," explaining that if the information that goes into an AI database is inaccurate the output will be inaccurate too. Among the pitfalls Linn sees with the use of AI is the unauthorized use of intellectual property. She pointed out that there have been numerous litigation matters filed "by authors, artists and others alleging that their information, their intellectual property, has been stolen and is being used to provide machine learning without permission, without licensing, without royalties. So, I think that's an area of risk that all companies, including law firms, need to be thinking about." Linn advises companies using generative AI to appoint a stakeholder team that evaluates risks and sets organizational strategies and controls around its use. Read the article.
