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JUDGMENTS

Key Decisions

16 May 2017 - Realview Holdings Pty Ltd And City Of Busselton [2017] WASAT 71 - Town planning -Development application - Land use classification - Restricted Business zone - Whether use correctly classified as 'Medical Centre' or 'Medical Centre and Shop' under local planning scheme - 'Best fit' - Words and phrases: 'pharmacy', 'pharmacist', 'medical centre', 'consulting rooms', 'professional accommodation', 'shop'.

The applicant sought a review of the respondent's decision to refuse a development application. The proposed development involved internal works to a previously approved building to use the premises as a medical centre, by creating consulting rooms, reception area, surgery and treatment room, staff room, pharmacy and toilets.

The issue was whether the proposed development application, and in particular the 'pharmacy' element, should be characterised as a 'Medical Centre' or 'Medical Centre and Shop' under the City of Busselton Local Planning Scheme No. 21. The land upon which the development was proposed was zoned as 'Restricted Business', meaning a 'shop' is prohibited. The applicant contended that the 'pharmacy' component is properly defined as a 'Medical Centre' or 'forming part of a Medical Centre', whereas the respondent argued it was a 'Shop' and therefore a prohibited use.

The Tribunal approved the application and set aside the respondent's initial decision. The decision was based on the definition of 'Medical Centre' in the Planning Scheme which included the "*professional accommodation for...pharmacists*". It concluded that a pharmacy provides 'professional accommodation' for pharmacists, and therefore should be categorised as a 'Medical Centre'. It rejected the respondent's argument that the decision would enable retailers to locate to the area, because most 'retailers' clearly fall within the term 'Shop' and would not be permitted in the 'Restricted Business' zone.

the appellant and respondent engaged in the business of funds management including investment bonds and funeral bonds. The respondent employed two individuals who were previously employed by the appellant. The respondent employed the individuals to develop a particular segment of its business using confidential information obtained by the employees, in breach of statutory duties owed by the employees to the appellant under the *Corporations Act* 2001 (cth) (**the Act**).

The issue WAS whether the respondent was knowingly concerned in the statutory contravention of the employee, giving rise to the appellant's right to be compensated for damage under the Act.

The Court found in favour of the appellant. It concluded that on the facts the respondent's Board was actually aware and had actual knowledge of the taking and using of confidential information. It held that the utilisation of confidential information by the Board in its decision-making process indicates the respondent was knowingly concerned in the breaches. The conduct of the respondent's CEO in working with the employees to prepare disclosure documents reinforced that the respondent was knowingly concerned in the Court awarded the appellant damages in the value of the respondent's capital profit for a five year period, being the five-year business plan established by the employees and the respondent using the confidential documents.

Australia. National Mental Health Commission

18 May 2017 - National Mental Health Commission acts on seclusion and restraint - The National Mental Health Commission calls for all mental health services to increase their effort towards eliminating the use of seclusion and restraint. The Commission's CEO, Dr Peggy Brown said everyone in a mental health service has a right to receive safe and contemporary care and to be treated with dignity and respect.

"A guiding principle underpinning safe and contemporary care of individuals with a mental illness is respect for human rights," Dr Brown said. "The system needs to be closely examined, so care can be delivered without using interventions that are experienced as adverse by consumers, cares and staff alike.

"We recommend the universal adoption of strategies and training guidelines which support the goal of eliminating seclusion and mechanical and physical restraint in mental health services."

The Commission produced the A case for change: Position Paper on seclusion, restraint and restrictive practices in mental health services and supports the newly released National Principles to Support the Goal of Eliminating Mechanical and Physical Restraint in Mental Health Services.

18 May 2017 - Media release: Meningococcal case - May 2017 - A case of invasive meningococcal disease has been notified in a 58-year-old man from metropolitan Adelaide. The man has been admitted to hospital in a serious condition. The meningococcal strain has been identified as serogroup W.

SA Health has identified multiple people who had contact with the patient, three of whom have been directed to receive antibiotic chemoprophylaxis. There have been eight cases of invasive meningococcal disease reported in South Australia this year, compared to 11 cases recorded at the same time last year. Three of these cases have been B strain, three have been W strain and two have been Y strain.

12 May 2017 - CHSALHN - Media release: Volunteers celebrated across the state - Hundreds of volunteers who selflessly give their time to health services across rural South Australia are being thanked for their tireless dedication and support. During National Volunteer Week, Country Health SA Chief Executive Officer Maree Geraghty thanked all of the volunteers who work in hospitals, aged care and community health facilities across the state.

12 May 2017 - Media release: Businesses urged to check cooling towers following legionella cases May 2017 - Cooling tower operators in the southern metropolitan area are being urged to decontaminate air-conditioning and industrial cooling towers following the notification of three cases of Legionnaires' disease. SA Health's Director Health Protection Dr Chris Lease said cooling towers can grow and disperse Legionella bacteria if they are not properly maintained.

With a strong focus on cancer treatment, this landmark international agreement will enable the sharing of expertise in health care and patient safety, and investment in Victorian medical breakthroughs and technology development.

17 May 2017 - Better End-Of-Life Care In Regional Victoria - The Andrews Labor Government is ensuring that people in regional Victoria can access high quality and compassionate end-of-life care, closer to home. Minister for Health Jill Hennessy today announced the second round of the Andrews Labor Government's popular *Regional Health Infrastructure Fund* will open next Monday and, for the first time, be expanded to include publicly funded community palliative care services. 15 May 2017 - **Problem Gambling and Family Violence in Help-Seeking Populations: Co-occurrence, Impact and Coping** - This study was conducted by Auckland University of Technology to investigate coexisting problem gambling and family/whanāu violence. The study took place between June 2013 and March 2015, involving 454 clients of Ministry of Health funded problem gambling intervention services.

Australian Medical Association (AuMA)

18 May 2017 - AuMA welcomes deferral of Health Care Homes introduction - The Government has responded to AuMA advocacy and announced, as part of the 2017-18 Budget, that Health Care Home services will now have a deferred and phased start, with up to 20 Health Care Homes that are ready to

start delivering services commencing on 1 October 2017 and the remainder commencing on 1 December, 2017.

18 May 2017 - PIP eHealth Incentive – update on compliance processes - Further to the GP Network News articles published on 20 April 2017 and 10 May 2017, the Department of Health has now written to practices that it believed had not met their Shared Health Summary (SHS) upload targets under the PIP eHealth Incentive for the period 1 May 2016 to 31 January 2017. The AuMA advises practices to check their records to confirm that the SHS uploads and payments received concurs with the amounts stated in the Department's letter.

18 May 2017 - Federal Budget changes to the PIP QI incentive - In line with AuMA advocacy and consistent with the advice of the PIP Advisory Group, of which the AuMA is a member, the Government confirmed in the Federal Budget a revised scope of the Practice Incentives Program (PIP) new Quality Improvement (QI) Incentive and a deferred commencement of twelve months until 1 May 2018. The revised QI Incentive will now combine five existing incentives instead of the previously announced seven incentives.

18 May 2017 - AuMA Vice President discusses the medical workforce - AuMA Vice President, Dr Tony Bartone, took part in an hour-long discussion on ABC local radio's Nightlife program about the changing face of the Australian medical workforce. Dr Bartone said that balancing the numbers of GPs and other specialists, and medical workforce numbers in rural and regional Australia, was a challenge.

18 May 2017 - Celebrate being a Family Doctor by using the AuMA Family Doctor Logo - Today, as the World Organization of Family Doctors celebrates World Family Doctor Day, the AuMA is encouraging all our GP members to download and display the 2017 AuMA Family Doctor Logo. The Logo is a reminder to the community and your medical and health professional colleagues of the patient-centred, holistic, and longitudinal medical care you as a family doctor provide.

18 May 2017 - What's new in the latest MJA? - This month's issue of the *Medical Journal of Australia* features a Perspectives article on Australia's Health Care Homes by Professor Claire Jackson and past President of the AuMA, Dr Steve Hambleton. An editorial and research article discuss how to improve the frequency of eye examinations in people with diabetes.

18 May 2017 - Australia's Health Care Homes: Laying the right foundations - discusses the implementation of the Government's Health Care Home (HCH) initiative and the take home messages for HCHs in 2017. The authors state that refining the model for broader implementation is vitally important and that clinician leadership, patient engagement and commitment to digital change will be critical for success.

In - Adherence to diabetic eye examination guidelines in Australia: the National Eye Health Survey -Joshua Foreman and colleagues explored how well people with diabetes are adhering to the 2008 recommendations by the National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC) for regular eye examinations. It found that about half of all Indigenous Australians with diabetes and almost one-quarter of non-Indigenous Australians with diabetes did not have their eyes examined at the recommended frequency, placing them at risk of vision-threatening retinopathy. The authors recommend an integrated diabetic retinopathy screening service, particularly in remote areas. The editorial discusses the implications of the study's findings and further action that could be taken.
