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JUDGMENTS

New South Wales (NSW)

13 August 2015 - Waller v James [2015] NSWCA 232

The NSW Court of Appeal dismissed an appeal brought by the parents of a profoundly disabled boy after the primary judge gave judgement for the doctor who coordinated their in vitro fertilisation (IVF) treatment.

The proceeding concerned an alleged breach of contract and of duty by Dr Christopher James, the respondent, for failing to inform his patients, the appellants, of the hereditary risks of anti-thrombin deficiency (ATD).

The appellants' son, who was conceived through IVF, inherited ATD from his father. Four days after his birth, the infant suffered a form of stoke, causing severe disabilities.

The primary judge rejected the appellants' submission that their son's ATD had caused or materially contributed the stroke, concluding that although the respondent had breached his duty of care, the appellants' claim should be rejected because it failed to show causation, and because the claimed damage was too remote.

The Court of Appeal upheld the primary judge's findings on the respondent's duty, holding that the respondent had failed in his duty to adequately explain his reasons for referring the appellants for genetic counselling. However, the Court of Appeal rejected the appellants' claim on the basis of 'causation', finding that it would not be appropriate to extend the respondent's liability to all harm suffered as a consequence of the birth. Accepting that the stroke was unrelated to ATD, the Court further noted that no loss was shown to have been caused by the ATD. Hence, the Court dismissed the appeal.

Queensland

12 August 2015 - Downes v Affinity Health Pty Ltd [2015] QDC 197

The District Court of Queensland gave judgement for the defendant, Affinity Health Pty Ltd, in a negligence claim made by a former employee of the defendant. The claim concerned an injury sustained by the plaintiff while working as a nurse at the Selangor Private Hospital in Nambour.

During a night-shift, the plaintiff sustained injury to her lumbar spine by manually assisting an elderly patient back into bed. The patient had recently undergone a full hip-replacement, and the defendant was aware, among other things, that the patient had been assessed to have a moderate falls risk.

The plaintiff alleged that the defendant was negligent, having failed to fulfil its duty to its employees to use reasonable care to avoid injury that is reasonably foreseeable. The Court found that the risk of injury from patient handling was reasonably foreseeable. The Court further found that, while the defendant had not breached its duty by failing to provide additional staff, the defendant's failure to specifically notify existing staff of the need for heightened vigilance in the care of the relevant patient was more likely than not, unreasonable.

However, the plaintiff's claim failed on the issue of causation. The Court held that even if the defendant had reasonably informed the plaintiff of the need for vigilance, the plaintiff would not have avoided her injury. Indeed, the Court noted that the plaintiff could not have remained stationed at the bed-side of the patient as she was required to attend to other patients.
