Parties Seek to Settle Yahoo Data Breach Class Action for \$50M

We previously wrote about the <u>Yahoo data breaches</u>, subsequent <u>class action</u> pending in California, and the company's estimate of <u>potential settlement</u> costs. Based on the Plaintiffs' recent Motion for Preliminary Approval of Class Action Settlement, filed on October 22, 2018, the parties have tentatively agreed to settle the case for \$50,000,000 in settlement funds, \$35,000,000 in attorneys' fees, and \$2,500,000 in

Apple CEO Calls for Comprehensive U.S. Privacy Laws

Tim Cook, Apple CEO, recently delivered the keynote address for a privacy conference, attended by policy experts and European Union (EU) lawmakers in Brussels, Belgium, where he advocated for new data privacy laws in the United States, similar to the EU's General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR).

Cook said that modern technology has led to the creation of a "dataindustrial complex" in which personal data is "weaponized against us with military efficiency." According to Cook, this problem doesn't just affect individuals, but whole societies. <u>Read more</u>

Ford's Self-Driving Cars to Hit the Roads in D.C.

Last week, Ford Motor Company (Ford) announced its partnership with Washington, D.C.'s city government to start testing self-driving

cars in the beginning of 2019. Ford's self-driving startup business, Argo AI, has already started mapping the city. To date, self-driving cars have only been tested in suburbs and smaller cities. Ford plans to launch its self-driving ride service in 2021 and Washington D.C. will be its second launch city after Miami, Florida, where Ford is already testing. *Read more*

New Al Drive Service Launches in Arlington, Texas

Last week, Drive.ai officially launched a self-driving program in Arlington, Texas. This is the second self-driving service that it has launched on public roads in the last four months; the first was in Frisco, Texas. Drive.ai will deploy its self-driving vehicles in the downtown district which will make this technology available to more than 400,000 residents as well as visitors to the area. The fleet will run on-demand between fixed pick-up and drop-off locations. Rides can be requested either by using one of the kiosks located throughout the service area, or by downloading the Drive.ai app. *Read more*
