Climate Policy Update October 3, 2022

Good evening! This is Akin Gump's <u>weekly policy newsletter</u> on **climate change** policy and regulatory developments, providing information on major climate policy headlines from this past week and forthcoming climate-related events and hearings:

National

- Landmark \$7 Billion Clean Hydrogen Funding Opportunity Announced (Speaking Sustainability)
 The Department of Energy opened applications for the H2Hubs Program, which seeks to create "up to ten regional clean hydrogen hubs across the country" with a focus on "the production, processing, delivery, storage and end use of clean hydrogen."
- Manchin's Permitting Overhaul: Not Dead Yet (E&E News)

Sen. Joe Manchin (D-WV) removed his permitting reform language from a Continuing Resolution as it did not have the support to advance. However, Senate Majority Leader Chuck Schumer (D-NY) reiterated his commitment to pass permitting reform before the 117th Congress concludes.

• House GOP Agenda Light on Energy Details, Silent on Climate (E&E News)

House Republican Leadership released an agenda to campaign on for the midterms featuring "long-standing conservative energy priorities like expanded domestic production and regulatory reforms."



<u>Texas Wants Oversight of CO2 Wells. Other States May Follow.</u> (E&E News)

The Texas Railroad Commission is slated to "submit an application to [the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)] to obtain primary enforcement authority, or 'primacy,' over wells that are used to inject carbon dioxide deep into underground formations." North Dakota and Wyoming have obtained primacy and Louisiana has applied for such authority.

• Four in a Row: California Drought Likely to Continue (Cal Matters)

With its water year coming to an end, California is slated to experience a fourth drought year in a row. Moreover, a "La Niña climate pattern plus warm temperatures in the Western Tropical Pacific" may exacerbate California's dry season.

• <u>Seeking Public Comments on Pulling Out of RGGI</u> (CBS)

A public comment period regarding Gov. Glenn Youngkin's (R-VA) plan to pull Virginia out of the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative (RGGI) opened September 26 and will remain open until October 26.

International

<u>Russian Pipeline Leaks Spark Climate Fears as Huge Volumes of Methane Spew into the Atmosphere</u> (CNBC)
 Gas leaks along pipelines between Russian and Germany "sent huge volumes of methane, a potent greenhouse gas, into the atmosphere." The leak has an estimated climate impact of 7.5 million metric tons of carbon.
