OHIO EPA RULEMAKINGS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

<u>Air</u>

Stakeholder Input Requested on Rules - OAC Chapter 3745-21, Carbon Monoxide, Photochemically Reactive Materials, Hydrocarbons, and Related Materials Standards: Ohio EPA is requesting stakeholder input on potential amendments to the rules in Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Chapter 3745-21, "Carbon Monoxide, Photochemically Reactive Materials, Hydrocarbons, and Related Materials Standards." The rules in this chapter establish requirements for the control of emissions of volatile organic compounds (VOCs) and carbon monoxide (CO) from stationary emission sources. The intent of these rules is to limit emissions of VOCs and CO to allow the state of Ohio to attain and maintain National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) for ozone and CO. The early stakeholder outreach fact sheet can be viewed here. Ohio EPA is accepting comments on these potential changes through October 18, 2019.

Stakeholder Input Requested on Rules - OAC Chapter 3745-111, ERC Banking Program Rules: Ohio EPA is requesting stakeholder input on potential amendments to the rules in Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Chapter 3745-111, "ERC Banking Program Rules." The rules in this chapter contain the rules governing the emission reduction credit (ERC) banking program. ERCs are credits representing the reduction of emissions at a facility that can be used as credit to offset increased emission at the same or a different facility. This chapter contains requirements defining how these credits are identified, transferred, and applied. The early stakeholder outreach fact sheet can be viewed here. Proposed 'No Changes' Rulemaking Governing Underground Injection Control Rules: Division of Drinking and Ground Waters (DDAGW) is proposing "no change" to several rules in Chapter 3745-34 of the Ohio Administrative Code. DDAGW has reviewed these rules to satisfy the five-year rule review requirements of section 106.03 and 106.031 of the Ohio Revised Code. OAC Chapter 3745-34 sets forth the regulations for construction, permitting, maintenance, operations and closure of underground injection wells. DDAGW is proposing to file the following rules with no changes.

Division of Environmental Response and Revitalization

Decision Document: On September 4, 2019, the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) finalized a Decision Document identifying the selected alternative to remediate contamination at the Phthalchem Site located at 266 West Mitchell Avenue, Cincinnati, Hamilton County, Ohio (Site). The Site, currently owned by Sun Chemical, is vacant. Phthalchem began operations at the facility in 1977 and ceased operations in 1996. During that time, Phthalchem manufactured phthalocyanine chemicals. The selected alternative includes institutional controls through the establishment of an environmental covenant (EC), continued operation and maintenance of the ground water interceptor system and slurry wall, with long-term ground water monitoring and free product removal, and continued monitoring of weep holes in Mill Creek. September 3, 2019: Great One Trading Inc. issued a food recall on undeclared egg in the following products. QQ Fish Mushroom Fish Ball UPC 8886325910123, and QQ Fish Tofu Style Fried Fish Cake UPC 8886325910116; both with expiration date 01/19/2020. Additional information is available here. This recall was expanded on September 5, 2019 to include QQ Fish Crab Flavoured Seafood Ball UPC 8886323239004, QQ Fish Cuttle Fish Flavoured Seafood Ball UPC 8886323239011, QQ Fish Shrimp Flavoured Seafood Ball UPC 8886323239028; all with the expiration date 01/19/2020. The Milk Lady's, Peaceful Baby, and Diges-Teas were distributed in Oregon and Washington through New Seasons Market, and nationwide through Azure Standard, Mountainmels.com, and Amazon.com. September 4, 2019: Dog Goods is voluntarily expanding this recall to include all 30-packs of "Berkley & Jensen" brand pig ears sold at BJ's Wholesale Club stores. Dog Goods purchased these pig ears from a single supplier in Brazil from September 2018 through August 2019. Additional information is available here.

September 9, 2019: The FDA is advising consumers to not eat yellowfin tuna steaks from the seafood counter or seasoned yellowfin tuna steaks in store-prepped Styrofoam trays from Kroger retail stores in AL, AR, GA, IL, IN, KS, KY, MI, MO, MS, NE, OH, SC, TN, VA and WV with sell by dates from August 29, 2019 and September 14, 2019 because they may cause scombroid poisoning. Scombroid poisoning is caused by eating fish that has not been properly refrigerated or preserved and therefore contains high levels of histamine. September 9, 2019: Conagra Brands is voluntarily recalling a limited quantity (approx. 2,200 cases) of Udi's Classic Hamburger Buns due to the potential presence of small pieces of white plastic. The company discovered the issue which occurred when a dough scraper was inadvertently incorporated into the production process for a small amount of the product. September 10, 2019: Hometown Food Company initiated a limited, voluntary, consumer-level recall of approximately 374 cases of two specific lot codes of its Martha White Gluten Free Sweet Cornbread Muffin Mix (UPC Item Code 0 1330082014 8), due to standard quality batch testing that indicated the presence of gluten derived from wheat, rye, barley, or crossbreeds of these grains. September 13, 2019: Stark Group International of Greenvale, New York is recalling all codes of its 100 gram packages of Ritter Sport - KAFFEESPLITTER because they may contain undeclared milk allergens. September 17, 2019: General Mills announced a voluntary national recall of five-pound bags of its Gold Medal Unbleached All Purpose Flour with a better if used by date of September 6, 2020. The recall is being issued for the potential presence of E. coli O26 which was discovered during sampling of the five-pound bag product. Additional information is available here.

September 18, 2019: Fitoterapia USA Inc., is voluntarily recalling 19,000 bottles of MACHO ARTIFICIAL PASSION FRUIT FLAVORED VITAMIN C LIQUID SUPPLEMENT, liquid dietary supplement to the consumer level. FDA analysis has found the product to be tainted with Tadalafil. Tadalafil is an active ingredient in a FDA approved prescription drug that is used for the treatment of male erectile dysfunction. The presence of Tadalafil in Mero Macho renders it an unapproved drug for which safety and efficacy have not been established and, therefore, subject to recall. September 18, 2019: Perdue Foods, LLC, a Perry, Georgia establishment, is recalling approximately 495 pounds of frozen ready-to-eat chicken products due to misbranding and undeclared allergens.
