European Commission hosts first EU-China-US product safety summit

The International Organization for Standardization (ISO) has updated its guide for addressing environmental issues in product standards, according to The Environmental Leader. The new guide, ISO Guide 64:2008 offers product standards writers a step-by-step approach to identify and understand basic environmental aspects, as well as impacts related to the product's entire life-cycle. The guide recommends standard writers to conduct life-cycle evaluations of a product early on in the standard development.

EPA advisers seek review of perchlorate standard

Scientific advisers have urged the EPA to delay final action on its decision not to set a federal drinking-water standard for the chemical perchlorate, found in rocket fuel. Advisers said the computer model from the Chemical Industry Institute of Toxicology - which the EPA relied heavily upon in making its decision - has not been adequately evaluated by other scientists. They asked that the deadline for public comment be moved to early 2009.

FDA to delay scores of Chinese imported products due fear of melamine contamination

The FDA will now detain scores of products imported from China due to concerns of melamine contamination. Under this action, dozens of Chinese-imported items that contain milk products will be held at the border until the importers can prove the items are not tainted with melamine or are not made with milk or milk-derived ingredients.

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
