

App Shootout: Google Shopper vs. Pricegrabber

Remember <u>Pricegrabber?</u> It was always one of my favorite price comparison sites. In fact, it wasn't that long ago that <u>Pricegrabber</u> saved me about \$100 when I bought my new <u>Fujitsu ScanSnap Scanner</u>. So I'm still a fan. But today's savvy buyer wants mobility. Price checks on-the-go using voice or image search and alerts when products go on sale. Meet the apps: <u>Google Shopper</u> (just released in February) and <u>Pricegrabber</u>:
