New Canadian Privacy Legislation on the Horizon

This week, the Canadian government proposed new legislation in Bill C-11, or the Digital Charter Implementation (the ACT), which includes some hefty fines for companies for violations - up to five percent of their revenue or C\$25 million, whichever is higher. The Act would increase protections for Canadians' personal information by giving citizens more control and greater transparency from companies handling their information. The Act addresses consent, data portability, consumer control over their "online identity" and disposal of personal information, as well as de-identification rules. REMINDER: Renew Your Drone Registrations

The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) issued a reminder this week for all those whose drone registrations expire next month. If an individual or business registered a drone directly with the FAA through its DroneZone, you should log into your account to renew your registration. If you registered using a third-party service, you should contact that company to request DroneZone login credentials or create a new account and obtain a new registration. *Read more*

Walmart's COVID-19 Testing by Drone Pilot Program

If you live within a one and a half-mile radius of the east side of the Walmart store in El Paso, Texas in a single-family home, within a one-mile radius of the North Las Vegas Walmart store in a single-family home, or within a one-mile radius of the Cheektowaga, New York Walmart store, then you are eligible to take part in the COVID-19 testing delivery-by-drone pilot program. It works like this: A drone drops off a testing kit with a self-administered nasal swab; the patient then ships the sample to Quest Diagnostics using a pre-paid shipping envelope. The results are provided to the patient online. *Read more*
