

Tampa Personal Injury Lawyer Notes New Report Saying Many Teens Not Receiving Driver's Ed

A new study from the Center for Injury Research and Prevention at The Children's Hospital of Philadelphia shows that as many as 20 percent of teen drivers have never completed a driver's education course prior to getting a license, even in states that require them.

Published in the journal *Pediatrics*, the survey included responses from more than 1,700 high school students from 34 states, including Florida and 24 other states that have a driver's education requirement. In the states with no driver's education requirement, as many as one in three teens had not taken a driving safety course prior to obtaining a driver's license.

Florida teen drivers between the ages of 15 and 17 are required to complete the Traffic Law and Substance Abuse Education program prior to obtaining a learner's or graduated license. Driver's education courses offered by county and local school boards may substitute for this requirement.
