The New York Times reported yesterday that the total damage inflicted by Hurricane Irene may reach \$7 billion by the time the storm dissipates in the coming days, making 2011 one of the insurance industry's worst years. The most expensive disaster by far was Hurricane Katrina in 2005, which caused \$45 billion worth of damage, the second at \$23 billion was the September 11, 2001 terrorist attacks on the World Trade Center and Pentagon.
