Welcome to the September edition of the Alston & Bird CPSC Recall Snapshot.

Last month, the CPSC announced a nearly \$6 million civil penalty against a U.S. retailer for selling recalled products. According to the civil penalty settlement agreement, the company inadvertently sold approximately 2,800 recalled products during a four-year period. Over that same four-year period, the company sold millions of products. Many have questioned whether the small number of recalled products that slipped through the complex retail network merited such a significant penalty. In fact, Acting Chairman Ann Marie Buerkle voted against the civil penalty and voted in favor of reducing it to \$1 million.

In other news, the CPSC commissioners recently unanimously agreed to remove seven plastics from the requirement of independent third-party testing for compliance with the mandatory phthalates prohibitions on children's toys and child care articles. Specifically, the commission determined that children's toys and child care articles containing polypropylene (PP), polyethylene (PE), high-impact polystyrene (HIPS), acrylonitrile butadiene styrene (ABS), general-purpose polystyrene (GPPS), medium-impact polystyrene (MIPS), and superhigh-impact polystyrene (SHIPS) with specified additives would comply with the CPSC's requirements with a high degree of assurance, and thus do not require third-party testing for prohibited phthalates.

Perhaps more interestingly, in a press release addressing this vote by the CPSC, Chairman Buerkle stated that she believes "this is one of the most significant burden reduction steps the CPSC has taken in recent years." She further explained that "reducing unnecessary regulatory burdens is a top priority for me, and I intend to do what I can to accelerate our efforts to reduce regulatory burdens wherever possible." In line with that priority she requested that "CPSC stakeholders ... bring opportunities for burden reduction to my attention. One way to do so is to submit written comments in response to the Commission's Request for Information on Potentially Reducing Regulatory Burdens Without Harming Consumers, 82 Fed. Reg. 27636 (June 16, 2017). The deadline for comments in that proceeding is September 30, 2017."
