

Climate Policy Update

June 21, 2022

Good evening! This is Akin Gump's <u>weekly policy newsletter</u> on all things **climate change.** Below are the major federal climate policy headlines of the past week:

- House Appropriators Release Bill to Bolster EPA, Interior (E&E News)
 - House appropriators proposed a budget increase for the Interior Department and the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). Under the legislation, the EPA would receive \$11.5 billion, while the Interior Department's budget would increase to \$16.6 billion, for fiscal year 2023.
- House Democrats Nudge Senate on Reconciliation Package (E&E News)
 175 members in total from the Leaders of the New Democrat Coalition, the Progressive Caucus and the Sustainable Energy and Environment Coalition urged President Biden and Senate Democrats to strike a deal on the revived reconciliation package.
- <u>Biden Announces New Initiatives to Curb Methane During International Climate Meeting</u> (CNN)
 At the Major Economies Forum on Energy and Climate, President Biden announced the U.S. and European Union's pledge to reduce their global methane emissions by 30 percent by 2030.
