## INTRODUCTION

## ELECTION 2022

The 2022 midterm elections produced modest, but perhaps still significant, changes to Congress. Democrats outperformed in many parts of the country, significantly stemming the tide of the "red wave" many analysts were expecting.

The results for partisan control of Congress remain in doubt.

The power balance in the **U.S. Senate** may not be known until next month, but the Democrats are seemingly poised to retain control. The Pennsylvania Senate seat flipped to the Democrats, while the Nevada Senate seat could flip to the Republicans with the Democratic incumbent currently behind. The Arizona Senate seat remains uncalled, with the incumbent party narrowly positioned to win. That would leave the Senate tied, waiting for the results of a Georgia run-off in December to determine which party controls the Senate.

The **House of Representatives** appears likely to shift to Republican control, but by the slimmest of margins. The final outcome and margins in the House will not be known until more votes are counted and several very close races are called. If Republicans win control of the House, as seems likely, it is unclear if their razor-thin majority—which could be between two and 12 seats—will allow their leaders to govern effectively.

To help assess the 2022 midterm election, we have prepared a comprehensive guide that summarizes the results and their impact on the 118th Congress, which convenes in January. The Election Guide lists all new members elected to Congress, updates the congressional delegations for each state, and provides a starting point for analyzing the coming changes to House and Senate committees, including potential new chairs and ranking members.

## Our committee analysis assumes that the Democrats retain control in the Senate, but Republicans flip the House and chair committees.

#### ABOUT THE 2022 ELECTION GUIDE

K&L Gates is providing this guide to help you better understand and keep track of the changes in Congress. It provides a starting point for assessing the coming changes in House and Senate Committee and Subcommittee memberships. The following are included within this guide:

- All new Members of Congress are listed alphabetically by state along with links to their campaign websites, which contain biographical information. Outgoing Members of Congress are listed, with the reasons for their departures.
- Complete delegations for each state are included with new Members of the House and Senate highlighted in yellow to indicate no change in party and their predecessors shown. Seats that switched parties are highlighted in red for Republican pick-ups and blue for Democratic pick-ups. Races that are too close to call are marked with an asterisk and highlighted gray.
- Roster lists for each full Committee from the departing 117th Congress are included, with nonreturning members lined out. The full Committee House and Senate Chairs and Ranking Members noted reflect the most likely candidate for this position; if there is no clear candidate, the position will be marked "Vacant" with possible Members italicized. We will continue to update the Committee information as Chairs and Ranking Members are selected and the rosters are finalized for the new Congress.
