

When Do Fosamax Femur Fractures Occur

If you've suffered either, it may have been totally unexpected.

Femur Fractures

This is the largest and among the strongest bones in your body, so there's no reason to suspect that it may suddenly fracture without any trauma being inflicted upon it. These fractures have occurred out of nowhere for some women, which is believed to be linked to this drug.

This drug is intended to strengthen the bones, but it has an effect on how the body renews bone tissue. Over time, it's believed that the bones suffer in terms of strength because of this, leading to fractures and other issues that can cause immense pain and suffering. These fractures can also result in the woman being bedridden for a long time while they heal, particularly if it exacerbates an already existing problem that the woman has with her bone tissue. This may mean a significant loss of wages and other hardships that the sufferer should have never had to endure.

Taking Action
