

## California Conflict Minerals Bill To Be Heard Today

In this <u>post</u> last month, I wrote about SB 861 authored by <u>Senator Ellen Corbett</u>. This bill would prohibit a "scrutinized company" from bidding on or submitting a proposal for a contract with a state agency. Although the bill was <u>amended</u> on April 7, 2011 to clarify some of the language, the author has so far declined to correct numerous embarrasing technical errors that I pointed out in this <u>comment letter</u> (for example, referring to the Securities <u>and</u> Exchange Act of 1934 and the Securities Exchange Commission).

The bill is scheduled to be heard today by the Senate <u>Governmental Organization Committee</u>, which is chaired by <u>Senator Roderick Wright</u>. Accordingly to the committee consultant's <u>analysis</u>, concerns exist whether it is premature for California to enact legislation before the Securities and Exchange Commission adopts its own conflict minerals rules. As <u>Broc Romanek</u> reported yesterday in this <u>post</u>, the SEC has recently pushed back its <u>estimate</u> of when it will adopt its final rules to August–December.

The committee analysis note substantial support and opposition to SB 861.
