KPPU reforms procedural law and organization structure

On 1 July 2019 the Indonesian competition authority – Komisi Pengawas Persaingan Usaha (KPPU) – <u>reformed its</u> <u>organizational structure</u> in order to gear up for more efficient enforcement. As part of the organizational reform, KPPU established the Directorate of Economics, the Directorate of Competition Policy, and the Directorate of Competition Advocacy

and Partnership (Small Medium Enterprise/SME) under the Deputy of Research and Advocacy. KPPU's Directorate of Merger & Acquisition and the Directorate of Partnership (Small Medium Enterprise/SME) were also restructured under the Deputy of Law Enforcement.

On 10 June 2019 the Supreme Court of the Republic of Indonesia issued Circular No. 04 of 2019 on Mandatory e-court Registration for Civil Claims to further promote the use of ecourts in 56 District Courts across Java and all major cities in Indonesia.
