The third round of talks on "renegotiation and modernization" of the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) was held in Ottawa, Canada, from September 23-27, 2017. President Trump Issues Order Prohibiting Chinese Company Acquisition Of U.S. Semiconductor Business

On September 13, 2017, President Trump issued an Executive Order prohibiting the acquisition of U.S. company Lattice Semiconductor Corporation (Lattice) by a group of companies, including Canyon Bridge Fund I, LP (CBFI); CBFI's subsidiaries, CBFI's limited partner, Yitai Capital Limited (Yitai); and Yitai's parent company, China Venture Capital Fund Corporation Limited. President Trump took this action <u>pursuant to</u> legislation that allows the President "to suspend or prohibit certain acquisitions of U.S. businesses by foreign persons where he finds that there is credible evidence that the foreign interest exercising control might take action that threatens to impair national security," provided other areas of law are insufficient. **More** »
