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What Corporate Counsel Don't Like about BIG Law Firms



It's not often we hear from corporate counsel. So when *Inside Counsel* magazine published the 20th Annual Survey of General Counsel - the legal field sat up and took note.

The survey, published in the August 2010 issue, candidly illustrates how in-house counsel feel about their outside law firms. Their opinions are informative and eye-opening to say the least.

What in-house counsel *don't like*:

- Failure to understand their business (<u>only 41%</u> "say law firms understand their business")
- Not "actively seek(ing) ways to reduce costs," according to 65% of survey respondents
- 51% "don't think law firms recognize their budget constraints."



What in-house counsel would like to see:

- Firms seeking creative solutions 82%;
- Industry-related experience 86% want this
- Responsiveness 99.5%
