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DRILLERS FORM SHALE COALITION

Range Resources, Chief Oil & Gas, Chesapeake Energy and other companies drilling in the Marcellus Shale have agreed to formally establish the Marcellus Shale Coalition (MSC) as an independent nonprofit organization. MSC joins the Pennsylvania Oil & Gas Association (POGAM) and the Independent Oil & Gas Producers of Pennsylvania (IOGA) as the third statewide association in Pennsylvania. The Marcellus Shale is a sedimentary rock formation that contains largely untapped natural gas reserves.

A spokesman for MSC said the other groups helped the companies get started in the Shale, and they would be part of the new organization. "We felt that the Shale is such a new and large development in the industry, it warranted another group," said Ben McCue, a government affairs specialist with Chief Oil & Gas.

McCue said that MSC plans to hire a president and a full-time support staff by the end of January 2010. "It will be based either in Pittsburgh or Harrisburg," McCue said. "But whatever its location, it will be a statewide group."

The vice president of Appalachia Shale for Range Resources Corp., Ray Walker, Jr., said that MSC represents over 90 percent of the companies that have applied for permits to drill Marcellus Shale wells.

"The MSC has established itself as the leading voice for the companies exploring the Marcellus Shale, and continues to improve our stakeholders' understanding of how we safely extract natural gas and provide a needed boost to the economy of the commonwealth. The coming year will present new challenges and opportunities to tell the story of Pennsylvania's most important energy and economic development initiative in the past several decades, and the MSC is positioned to tell that story," Walker said.
