- 5. Maximizing annual gifts. One of the best ways to minimize future estate taxes is by gifting. You can transfer significant sums of money out of your estate, along with any appreciation, thereby reducing the tax. Even better planning would be to use your annual exclusion gifts, strategically, so that each annual gift can be leveraged into larger sums being transferred out of your estate. - 6. **Failure to Take Advantage of the Estate Tax Exemption in 2012.** Making lifetime gifts is a simple and effective estate planning method for minimizing estate taxes. It is important to note that the current estate tax regime exclusions (which are the highest they have been in the history of estate tax) is set to expire at the end of 2012. Thus, if you can afford to do so, make some significant gifts during 2012.
- 7. **Leaving assets outright to Adult Children.** It is becoming more common for assets, even those being transferred to adult children, to remain in a trust for as long as possible to take advantage of the asset protection and other benefits a trust has to offer. Trusts allow you flexibility to control the assets with a set of instructions that remain once you are gone. It also helps insure that your assets are given to those you love, not to creditors or ex-spouses.
