Plaintiff Leslie Thomas hereby moves pursuant to KRE 103(d) that the Court order as set forth below.

#### ARGUMENT

#### POINT 1

DEFENDANTS AND THEIR WITNESSES SHOULD BE PROHIBITED FROM ARGUING, STATING OR MENTIONING THAT PLAINTIFF HAS THE BURDEN OF PROOF ON HER CLAIMS.

"[T]he established rule in Kentucky is that the jury should not be told specifically that the burden of proof is on any party." Rankin v. Bluegrass Boys Ranch, Inc., Ky., 469 S.W.2d 767, 773 (1971); see also 2 Palmore, Kentucky Instructions to Juries § 13.11(f)(1989). Accordingly, defendants and their witnesses should be prohibited from arguing, stating or mentioning that plaintiff has the burden of proof on her claims.

### **POINT 2**

DEFENDANTS AND THEIR WITNESSES SHOULD BE PROHIBITED FROM ARGUING, STATING, OR MENTIONING THAT PLAINTIFF MUST PROVE HER CLAIMS BY A PREPONDERANCE OF EVIDENCE.

The rule in Kentucky is that "a jury should not be told... that a litigant must prove his or her case by a preponderance of the evidence." *Hall v.*Arnett by Greene, 709 S.W.2d 850, 852 (Ky. App. 1986); 2 Palmore, Kentucky

Instructions to Juries § 13.11(f)(1989). Accordingly, defendants and their witnesses should be prohibited from arguing, stating or mentioning that plaintiff's burden is to prove her claims by a preponderance of the evidence.
