

How to Choose a Legitimate Brain Injury Law Firm

If you or a person you now has been a victim of an accident, shooting spree, and any other incident through no fault of theirs, then you have very legal right to pursue a injury claim. Recognizing that right and accepting what has happened to you is the first step. Many lawyers tend to talk over the heads of the people who approach them. They may think that trying to sound more superior is going to impress you and gain your trust. That is, unless they have the patience to explain and answer all your questions.

This implies that the law firm you choose should be approachable and open to questions. Rushing you through an interview about your case, and subtly pressuring you do something they want you do to is not the kind of firm you should choose. You need to choose a firm because you believe in them, not because you feel pressured and intimidated by them and what you are planning to do.

Find out what their record is on previous **TBI cases**, and with the use of the internet, go over any data you may find on the law firm.

1. Read the terms of their contract.

Although you have the right to enforce the Contingent Fee Agreement, there are still many other terms that a law firm can demand from you. The Contingent Fee Agreement states that you can hire a lawyer but not be required to pay the fees upfront. You will need to know in advance how much percentage they will collect from the amount awarded, and agree to it.

A firm will also demand that other fees be paid as they are incurred such as doctor's fees for notes and consultation, police reports, miscellaneous office charges like photocopying, collecting of evidence, and documentation. Other firms can deduct these expenses from the amount awarded. This means you do have a choice in this matter.
