Presidential Proclamation Imposes Safeguard Tariff on Solar Panel Components

On January 23, 2018, President Donald Trump issued a presidential proclamation imposing a safeguard tariff on solar panel components. The tariff will not apply to the first 2.5 gigawatts of solar cells imported each year. However, the tariff will apply to countries that are currently exempt from certain tariffs—specifically, Canada, Mexico, and Korea. More »
