AllState Insurance Company recently released its annual list of the country's best drivers. The good news — Cape Coral drivers are among the safest in America.

In fact, Cape Coral topped all of the cities in Florida, coming in at 40 on the list. According to <u>AllState</u>, the average driver in Cape Coral will experience an auto collision every 10.6 years, which is 5.6 percent below the national average.

Other cities in Florida did not fare so well. Miami was ranked 187 with an average of 6.3 years between collisions. Tampa came in at 176 with drivers suffering an accident an average of every seven years.

Allstate uses its claims data to determine the crash frequency of the country's 200 largest cities compared to the national average. Since about 10 percent of the nation's insured drivers use AllState, its claims provide a fairly accurate picture of larger crash trends.

The designation of "America's Safest Driving City" went to Fort Collins, Colorado. This is the third time the city has garnered the top spot in the report's nine-year history. According to AllState, the average driver in Fort Collins will experience an auto collision every 13.9 years, which is 28.2 percent less likely than the national average of 10 years.
