A Rare Summary-Judgment Win for Plaintiff

SLG recently prevailed on cross-motions for summary judgment in an oil and gas case, resulting in a complete victory for the plaintiff. After trying a DTPA, fraud, and accounting dispute to a jury and

completing an appeal, the defendant operator contested the plaintiff's interest in production from the well and unilaterally reduced the amount of monthly payouts. SLG persuaded the trial court that it was too late for the operator to challenge the plaintiff's ownership interest and that the operator should pay damages and attorney fees.
