Back In October, I an interesting experience by being interviewed as part of the <u>"22 Tweets"</u> project. Its creator, Lance Godard, describes the project in this way: "Real-time Twitter interviews with practicing lawyers who tweet." The interview went out live, tweet by tweet, in a series of 22 tweets, over <u>Twitter</u>, the 140-character internet blogging service. People could follow it on Twitter, by following <u>@22Twts</u> and me at <u>@AndrewMcRoberts</u>, or by following the hashtag #22Twts on <u>www.Twitter.com</u>. I heard that folks across the country read the tweets, perhaps even internationally. Wow. Big stuff for a "local" government lawyer!
