FERC Order Announces Policy Shift To Limit Environmental Review in Pipeline Certification Decisions

Federal Energy Regulatory Commission Order announces unexpected policy shift to limit environmental review of natural gas infrastructure projects. FERC will no longer consider upstream or downstream greenhouse gas emissions data when reviewing pipeline certificate applications where there is not a sufficient causal relationship between the proposed project and the emissions. The 3-2 decision came just one month after the Commission's request for stakeholder input on how the Commission should adjust its evaluation of environmental impacts of proposed pipeline projects. On May 11, 2018, the Bureau of Safety and Environmental Enforcement ("BSEE") announced proposed revisions to the Well Control Rule, addressing several issues raised by industry when the rule was first issued in 2016 concerning well design, well control, casing, cementing, real-time monitoring, and subsea containment.
