(GEO), a publicly-held company located in Boca Raton, Florida, announced on November 3, 2020, that it is beginning to notify individuals following a ransomware attack that "impacted a limited amount of personally identifiable information and protected health information for some inmates and residents contained on certain servers for a small number of facilities including the South Bay Correctional and Rehabilitation Facility in Florida, a youth facility in Marienville Pennsylvania, and a now close facility in California. #### Fresh Produce Delivered Right to Your Door...By Drone

While drone deliveries have been tested for medical supplies, ecommerce/package delivery, and even pizza right from the oven, there are other, seemingly endless possibilities for delivery by drone. Recently, Reliable Robotics Corp. (Reliable Robotics) and Giumarra Companies (Giumarra), a distributor of fresh produce in California, joined forces to launch an automated flight test program to help solve supply chain and delivery challenges within the industry. Their first successful flight was conducted in August, when a drone delivered peaches from a farm to a grocery store within 24 hours of harvest.
